The world first got to know psychic medium Roy Tomko from his popular YouTube series, Reading the Queen and Reading the King. Fans of spirit channeling found his candid banter with drag queens and gay male models to be refreshing and fun. They enjoyed the anything goes mentality to the proceedings and that inevitable OMG moment when the celebrity begins to realize that the reading is, in fact, legit.

According to Tomko, blending the spirit world and the LGBTQ+ community has proved a match made in heaven. "It's a chance for me to provide healing to the community I love and am a proud member of and to show the world how beneath a drag queen's makeup and sequence or a gay king's muscles and spray tan, they are individuals like everyone else, seeking healing and messages from loved ones."

We spoke with Roy Tomko to learn more.

Do you see dead people?

Roy Tomko: (Laughing) Spirit has always been part of my life, for as long as I can remember. I started seeing Spirit at around three or four years old and into my teen years. Since then, Spirit has changed how it shows itself to me.

How so?

RT: Today, I'm claircognizant. Spirit appears to me more as a 'clear knowing.' It is a psychic ability that involves knowing information that I couldn't possibly know normally. You can imagine it as knowledge pouring into the top of my head.

We often hear that mediums have spirit guides.

RT: That is true, actually we all have spirit guides.

Who is your guide?

RT: I have a few. I have one that I count on a lot who is my main, and then I have a good amount more who step in for additional help when needed. I find spirit guides to be very personal. They are like family.

Is Spirit's goal to remain with their loved ones throughout the person's earthly life or are they only here for a short time while they are working to ascend to another realm?

RT: In my communications with Spirit, I have found that they are around us whenever we need them. They may step away for some moments, but they make themselves known again during times we call upon them or when we are going through something challenging in our lives. Can you read yourself?

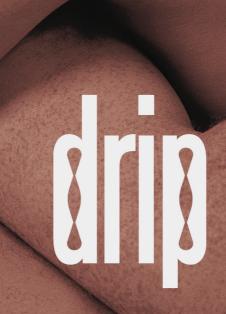

Danny Will Die Alone The Unconventional Romantic Comedy Series Begins Streaming on Dekkoo on May 16

Loosely based onJack Tracy's own dating life in New York City and his "Dying Alone Together" podcast, the series depicts Tracy as Danny: a man on a mission. Recently single after a devastating breakup and freshly entering a mid-life crisis, Danny finds the dating scene markedly different from the last time he was on the market. Emotional unavailability, fear of commitment and hypersexuality abound and Danny is forced to navigate his way through unhinged flakes, fakes, and bots, all while remaining blissfully unaware of his own multitude of flaws.

In addition to its jaw-droppingly vulgar humor, Danny Will Die Alone presents a critical look at modern dating and its shifting relationship styles. It explores how gay men use the apps, treat one another, and the differences in their behavior when interacting virtually and in-person. "On the apps, you're never quite sure if the man you are speaking with is looking for something real or if he simply enjoys the chase," Tracy explains.

He notes there is a huge emphasis on casual sex encounters today. "It's as if long term relationships and traditional dating structures have been abandoned by men in their 20s and 30s," Tracy continues. "Once you get into the 40s, it's a whole other macrocosm of messiness; mostly married couples who have opened their relationships and are looking for a temporary third to complete their throuple."

Initially built as a web series, the first nine episodes of Danny Will Die Alone are fifteen-minute affairs, each focusing solely on Danny's encounter with a man that represents a particular corner of the gay dating world. Characters pop into Danny's life only to never be heard from again, no different than how it goes while dating in the modern era.

It begins with Danny attempting to convert a well-endowed hookup into a forever partner. After that fails, he meets hipsters, conservatives, spiritual beings, gym gurus, and men with all kinds of kinky sexual proclivities. All the while, Danny breaks the fourth wall to regularly let viewers know what he's thinking about during the ongoing car crashes. "It's a way to bring the audience into Danny's issues," Jack explains. "The viewers become the confidant Danny vents to."


Viewers may sympathize with Danny, but not too much, because Danny is jaded to the point of near insanity, and is as awful as the situations he finds himself in. 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
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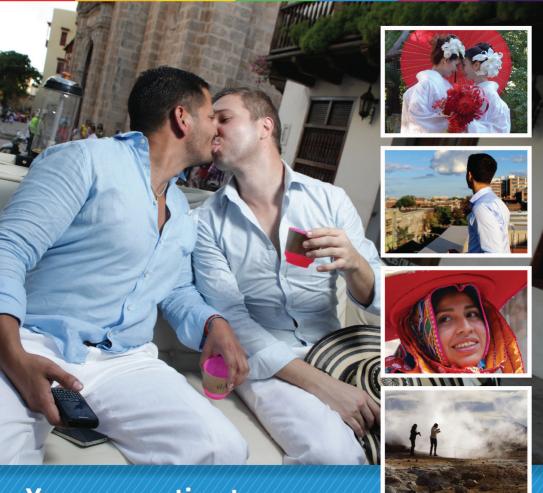
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
