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# q feature: JOHN DUFF DOES IT AGAIN

John Duff's first single off his yet untitled debut album, "Be Your Girl," is a celebratory anthem from another time. Simultaneously harkening Tom Jones, Cher, and Frank Sinatra, "Be Your Girl" is equally fresh and familiar.



Written by Duff, Eren Cannata (Grease: Rise of the Pink Ladies, Demi Lovato), and Koil PreAmple (Timbaland, Danity Kane) the explosive disco number with its 1940's inspired arrangement and top line is a romantic showstopper about unrequited love. Classic as it may sound, there's a twist.

"In today's modern world, when so many queer artists are releasing authentically queer music, I thought it would be fun to retroactively go back and design a legacy artist that never got a chance to exist," Duff explains. "In this song, I'm imagining a classic-that-never-happened from the point of view of a queer artist-that-never-was." John Duff's "Be Your Girl" is available now on Apple Music, Spotify, and all digital platforms.

"The song is about wanting to be chosen," continues Duff from his Massachusetts home. He admits it's a feeling he, as an artist, can relate with. "Every time I put out a new song, I have to compete for attention. You'd think after six years of releasing music, I wouldn't still be so desperate, but alas - here I am again, begging to 'Be Your Girl."

Every element of the music was played by human beings - creating a warm and timeless sound. John Duff produced the song with Koil PreAmple and Eren Cannata, with additional engineering by Niko the Kid. Eren Cannata played guitar and bass on the track. Drums are by Daniel Crean, with strings by Godfrey Furchtgott, horns by Aaron Janick, and Miles Dalto on keys.

The visual was creative directed by John Duff after a year of studying Busby Berkley films. He took his treatment to Shawn Adeli (who also directed John Duff's "High Heels" music video), to oversee the vision. It is glamorous and theatrical. "It's everything I want to see in the world, and simultaneously the antithesis of what is cool right now," Duff says. When it came to choreography, Duff called

his friend and collaborator Nico O'Connor (Britney Spears, Pink, Bad Bunny) and together they choreographed the homage to movie musicals. But that's not all - Duff singlehandedly costumed the entire video, outfitting himself, as well as the 38 other complete looks for the dancers - all of whom he personally selected with O'Connor. "It may seem like I micromanage, but I have a vision. My personal success is contingent upon its execution."

John Duff grew up in a suburb outside of Baltimore, Maryland, the youngest of two sisters and a brother. He describes his childhood as "cute." Like many young children, he faced constant bullying. "I couldn't even take the bus in middle school because other kids couldn't control themselves around me - they were so upset by my existence." He says he doesn't hold any animosity towards anyone, and is even grateful for all he experienced. "The world will never be safe - even nature wants to kill you. I'm lucky that I was able to understand the risk I was assuming in living authentically. Words are not scary."



John eventually left Maryland to study musical theater at Syracuse University and after graduating, he made his way to the bright lights of New York City. He worked professionally as an actor - performing regionally, Off-Broadway, and commercially for six years. He even directed a short-lived off-Broadway musical KatDashian's - a hybrid of Cats and The Kardashian's. The musical closed early after Andrew Lloyd Webber took legal action.

Since that time, John Duff has released multiple singles and music videos that have gone viral on social media including "House on Fire" and "Hokie Pokie". "The first part of my music career was a tribute to the kid that wanted to sing Britney Spears' songs in the talent show, but wasn't allowed. This new chapter is for the kid that took his parents' advice and sang Elvis and Frank Sinatra. Because honestly, they weren't wrong."

"Be Your Girl" is the first single from John Duff's upcoming concept album. It and the music that is to come, focuses on musicianship and nostalgia, and Duff says he will continue working in this traditional format. "There's a reason people don't make songs like this anymore," he reflects. "It ain't easy. If I can do this, I can do anything."

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
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# q community: ELSKA'S BODIES & VOICES

#### ELSKA HIGHLIGHTS THE BEAUTY OF INDIAN MEN IN NEW MUMBAI EDITION

Elska, a project dedicated to sharing the bodies and voices of LGBTQ communities around the world, has ventured to Mumbai for its latest edition. Inside, readers can get to know a selection of ordinary men from this iconic Indian metropolis through a combination of intimate and honest photography and personal storytelling.

"Quite soon after Elska was launched, people were describina it as a showcase for diversity, particularly in how it furthers visibility of different races, ages, and body types," says Elska editor and chief photographer Liam Campbell. "At first this was fullv unintentional - the point of Elska was just to travel to different cities, meet a random bunch of local guys, and then share their images and stories in some sort of print publication



— but once people started describing how much Elska's approach meant to them, and how they felt more a part of the LGBTQ community for seeing 'people like us,' I felt a responsibility to keep going. It was then after a chat with some friends in LGBTQ media who asserted that the South

Asian community sees the least representation that I decided to head to India for our next issue."

"This led us to Mumbai, which originally became the tenth issue of Elska" continues Liam. "However, the issue didn't do so well, becoming our all-time lowest seller at the time. However, as Elska has continued to grow over the years, having recently published our forty-sixth issue, I decided to do a reissue of Mumbai. While I'm not certain it will fare better this time, considering that South Asian visibility is still so low and undervalued, I'm absolutely proud of our Indian showcase, an issue that is one of my all-time favourites."



Inside Elska Mumbai and the companion zine Elska Ekstra Mumbai, readers are introduced to thirteen Mumbaikar men. Each was photographed in a natural, spontaneous style, both in their city's streets and in their homes, dressed in their own style or sometimes not dressed at all, creating a sort of sensual-documentary style.

The photos are then accompanied by personal stories penned by each of the thirteen subjects, letting you get to know them at an even more intimate level. The topics of these tales vary widely, including Rehaan D's series of imagined coming-out letters to his grandmother; Saif G's ode to chasing true love despite the impending doom of falling for someone of a different caste; and Faraz A's scandalously vivid poem about his love for foreskin.

'Elska Mumbai' is 180 pages and is available from a select group of shops around the world as well as for order online from the Elska website. In addition, the companion zine 'Elska Ekstra Mumbai

' is available, including hundreds of pages of outtakes, behind the scenes tales, and the stories and photos of a few humans from beyond Mumbai, including work by the guest photo-artists Mitch Cullen and Alcibiade de Paros.

#### Flame Con, the World's Largest Queer Comic Convention, Announces New Guests for Tenth Annual Expo

ND Stevenson and Sara Myer will join previously announced guest Molly Knox Ostertag; RuPaul's Drag Race star Megami to host. Fireball: The Official Flame Con After Party Tenth Anniversary Expo to Take Place in New York City at the Sheraton Times Square Hotel on August 17-18, 2024 with the addition of a third floor featuring an expanded Gaymer Lounge



Flame Con, created and produced by the LGBTQ+ non-profit Geeks OUT, continues to celebrate its tenth anniversary this year with the announcement of new special guests and expanded programming on a new third floor! The tenth annual Flame Con expo will take place on August 17 - 18 at the Sheraton Times Square Hotel in New York City. Featuring a comics, arts and entertainment expo that showcases creators and special guests from all corners of the LGBTQ+ community of fans, the two-day venture will include thoughtful discussions, exclusive performances, cosplay and more.

Flame Con is also adding a third floor to this year's convention space as they expand their Gaymer Lounge, a gaming-focused area to kick back and get immersed in a multitude of board games, card games, video games and TTRPGs. The Gaymer Lounge is operated by NYC Gaymers, a community-led LGBTQIA+ non-profit whose mission is to uplift the voices of marginalized gamers and sustain a diverse and passionate space that reflects both New York City and gaming culture. Through the Lounge, Flame Con and NYC Gaymers hope to continue to encourage members to learn new games, meet new people, take part in tournaments, and participate in the official Flame Con game!

Flame Con is excited to announce two new special guests for the 2024 expo: ND Stevenson and Sara Myer. ND Stevenson is an Emmy- and GLAAD Media Award-winning cartoonist and animation producer. The cartoonist is perhaps most well-known for creating and producing the Netflix series She-Ra and the Princesses of Power and for writing the science fantasy graphic novel Nimona. The novel was adapted into an animated feature film by Netflix in 2023 and went on to be nominated for Best Animated Feature at the 96th Academy Awards. Sara Myer is a comic artist, writer and colorist whose graphic memoir Monstrous: A Transracial Adoption Story was a finalist for the 2023 L.A. Times Book Prize. The graphic memoir also appeared on several Best of 2023 lists including the New York Public Library's Top 10 Books for Teens and the Boston Globe Best of 2023. Myer is currently the illustrator and cover artist of several comic issues of Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles: Saturday Morning Adventures.

Earlier, Flame Con announced Molly Knox Ostertag as the first of this year's special guests. Molly Knox Ostertag is the acclaimed ABA Indies and New York Times bestselling graphic novel author-

illustrator of The Deep Dark, The Girl from the Sea, and the Witch Boy trilogy: The Witch Boy, The Hidden Witch, and The Midwinter Witch, as well as a writer for animation. An animated musical adaptation of The Witch Boy has been announced on Netflix.

Other previously-announced guests for this year's expo include JP Karliak and Kris Anka. JP Karliak has voiced iconic animated characters including Wile E. Coyote, the Boss Baby, Willy Wonka, and a slew of Marvel heroes and villains including Morph in X-Men '97 and Green Goblin in Spidey and His Amazing Friends. In 2025, he'll star opposite Rihanna in a new animated Smurf movie. Karliak is the founder and president of Queer Vox, a non-profit training academy that advocates for authentic and equitable casting opportunities for LGBTQ+ voice talent. Kris Anka is a designer and artist best known as a lead character designer on Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse. He has also worked as a designer on My Adventures With Superman and as a comic artist on titles like The White Trees at Image Comics, and on Marvel Comics titles such as Runaways, Uncanny X-men, Star-Lord, and Captain Marvel.

To celebrate the expo and its special anniversary, Fireball: The Official Flame Con After Party will be held on Saturday, August 17 at Hell's Kitchen's Industry bar. Fireball is a 21+ celebration of queer geek culture featuring drag, burlesque, dancing and all the queer joy you can handle. This year's party will be hosted by Megami, cast member in the recent season 16 of RuPaul's Drag Race.

Of the convention, Nic Gitau, President of Geeks OUT, says: "For years, the constant refrain we'd hear attending other conventions was 'Wouldn't it be cool if..? Wouldn't it be cool if... there was a safe space for LGBTQ+ fans to connect?' or, 'Wouldn't it be cool if... there was a show that proved audiences were hungry for unapologetically queer storytelling?' Over the last ten years Flame Con has become a home for queer fans, championed queer stories, and celebrated queer creators as their careers have sparked and exploded. We're grateful for a community that's grown exponentially each year and we're excited to gather the best of LGBTQ+ comics and pop culture once more, in what will be a standout 10th anniversary show."

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# q concert: MAXIM VENGEROV

#### Castiglione and Greg Hocking present Grammy Award winner Maxim Vengerov live in concert in Brisbane, Melbourne and Sydney from 5 August

Universally hailed as one of the world's finest musicians, and often referred to as the greatest living string player in the world today, Grammy award winner Maxim Vengerov will tour Australia in celebration of his 50th Birthday this August.

Joined by one of Europe's most iconic pianists Polina Osetinskaya, the master violinist will appear at Queensland Performing Arts Centre (QPAC) on 5 August, Arts Centre Melbourne's Hamer Hall on 7 August and Sydney Opera House's Concert Hall on 10 August 2024.

Classical music lovers are speedily securing their seats to Vengerov's Hamer Hall recital via Arts Centre Melbourne. while Brisbane and Sydney recitals are selling fast via Sydney Opera House and OPAC.



Vengerov recently completed triumphant, sell-out concerts at New York's Carnegie Hall and London's Royal Albert Hall. His last tour of Australia in 2015 was a highly lauded, sold out success, so this return in recital is eagerly anticipated by audiences across the country.

The superstar string player's 50th birthday program celebrates 42 years of public appearances with a program that will include demanding and exciting works by Ravel, Franck and Prokofiev as well as virtuosic encores.

Castiglione Arts and Culture is also proud to announce three exclusive masterclasses with the world leading violinist. The Sydney Masterclass on 12 August will see partner with the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, while the Melbourne Masterclass on 8 August is presented in partnership with Melbourne Youth Orchestras. The Brisbane Masterclass on 6 August is presented with Griffith University. Tickets to all masterclasses are extremely limited, and tickets are expected to sell out fast.

Vengerov and Osetinskaya have performed together extensively, including to rapturous applause at Carnegie Hall. In the season 2023/2024 Polina Osetinskaya makes a number of her solo debuts at the Berlin Philharmonic, in London and in Laeiszhalle in Bach's concerts without a conductor.

Since the beginning of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Polina has repeatedly expressed her pacifist position. In this regard, her concerts in Russia were cancelled by the government. She has since toured the world extensively including to both North and South America.

Music lovers are invited to take part in this historic event, and witness true virtuosos live and in person at Australia's greatest concert halls.

# q icon: TASTY NIGHTCLUB ANNIVERSARY

#### Iconic 90s Club to celebrate milestone in Melbourne/Naarm Queer History 30th Anniversary of the notorious Tasty Nightclub Raid

This year marks the 30th anniversary of the notorious Tasty Raid, an event that forever changed Melbourne/Naarm's LGBTQI+ history. On this landmark occasion, the iconic 90s queer nightclub, Tasty, will be honoured with a spectacular one-night celebration on Saturday, August 10 at Inflation, bringing together the community to remember and rejoice.

The Tasty Raid occurred in 1994, when 467 patrons of Tasty were unjustly strip-searched by Victoria Police. The raid, later deemed unlawful, sparked international outrage and became a pivotal moment in Australia's LGBTQI+ history, often likened to the Stonewall uprising in the United States.

To commemorate this significant event, a fabulous evening has been planned at Inflation, one of Melbourne/Naarm's most renowned party venues. Tasty cofounder and DJ Gavin Campbell has reunited with long-time collaborators Gerard O'Connor and Jono Francisco to curate an event that spans four fantastic levels, including the venue's rooftop bar, Top Yard. Each level will be brimming with vibrant queer energy and entertainment.

The night will be soundtracked by three of Tasty's original 90s DJ legends, along with two 21st-



century DJ additions and two current local favourites. Live performances throughout the evening will add to the excitement, making the Tasty Raid 30th anniversary the most talked-about club event of 2024.

Highlights of the night include an exclusive three-hour back-to-back set by original Tasty resident DJs Peter McNamara and Gavin Campbell, followed by another original 90s Tasty DJ, Arlen de Silva. Also performing is DJ legend Debra Walters, whose debut set at the Tasty Raid 20th anniversary in 2014 is still remembered fondly. Current Melbourne/Naarm favorites Hip Hop Hoe (Pony Club Gym) and Sugar Plump Fairy, the mastermind behind the quarterly dance sensation Bruno, will also grace the decks.

Inflation's ground-level cafe area will transform into a late-night performance space, featuring an extravaganza of queer talent, film and video screenings, and DJ Philvester, another eclectic Tasty favorite.

In the 1990s, Tasty introduced the concept of a safe, consensual play area/darkroom to Melbourne/ Naarm nightclubs, infamously dubbed The Grope Maze. The Tasty Raid 30th Anniversary event will also include this feature, spanning the entire Inflation basement, created exclusively for Tasty by legendary Trough X producer and designer, Nik Dimopoulos.

#### COTA SA RELEASES RAINBOW RIGHTS TOOLKIT FOR LGBTI+ COMMUNITY



COTA (Council of the Ageing) SA has released its new Rainbow Rights toolkit to help older LGBTI+ community members to understand and action their rights, including in the later stages of their lives, and build awareness amongst the people who will be part of their choices, supports and care. COTA SA has created this resource in partnership with the South Australian Government's Office for Ageing Well, to share information about services and programs that safeguard the rights of older LGBTI+ people. The toolkit focuses on topics including overcoming discrimination, housing, health, and planning ahead.

COTA SA Chief Executive, Miranda Starke, is proud to offer this toolkit to the rainbow community to assert and safeguard their rights over a lifetime. "The Rainbow Rights toolkit focuses on supporting older LGBTI+ people with information and the confidence to seek and accept help when it is needed, as well as to offer support to other community members," Miranda said. Through COTA SA's engagement with older LGBTI+ people, they have told us they have often faced discrimination through their lifetime and experienced challenges accessing services tailored to their needs. They are also less likely than the general population to access intergenerational and family support, due to being more likely to be single, childless and no longer in contact with their biological family.

"COTA SA will continue to advocate at a systems level to address the challenges facing older LGBTI+ South Australians, and our new Rainbow Rights toolkit is a great resource to help individuals really understand what services are out there to assist them in ageing well."

Rainbow Rights follows the success of COTA SA's Rainbow Horizons project, an important initiative designed to create greater cross-generational support in relation to end of life planning, care and dying for LGBTI+ people.

The toolkit was recently launched at COTA SA's Rainbow Rights in Action Forum by Minister for Seniors and Ageing Well Nat Cook MP, and featured broadcaster and journalist, Julie McCrossin AM leading a panel of experts who shared their views and lived experiences.

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
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
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






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
